
Here is Sarah's story.

RECOGNITIONS AND PRESENTATIONS




Sally A. French, MSN, APN, PMHNP-BC will be presenting at the American Psychiatric Nurses Association (APNA) 38th Annual Conference.

Externship Program on North 7 the Trauma Medical Surgical Floor. In 2008 I graduated from Widener University and worked as a registered nurse on N7, TSDU, TICU and TAA. I graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 2013 with my master's degree as an AGACNP. I am currently still involved in seeing patients a few times per month although the majority of my time is spent running the Trauma **Outreach and Injury Prevention** Program for the Department. As the only level 1 Trauma Center in South Jersey an injury prevention program is a required part of our certification. The focus of the program is to provide free education and resources to the community with the focus being on our top three mechanisms of injury: falls, motor vehicle crashes and blunt trauma. My resource

catchment area includes Burlington to Cape May County.

Some programs that are offered include Stop the Bleed, Distracted Driving, fall prevention initiatives and our Trauma Injury Prevention Program. I work in collaboration with Robert Wood Johnson, another Level 1 Trauma Center that covers parts of the northern part of the state, on the Safety Ambassador Program and in developing a Pediatric Stop the Bleed Program. I am in the process of initiating an evidence based practice (EBP) program called Bingocize to assist in fall prevention and safe mobility. I work closely with our Military, Diplomatic and Field Surgical Affairs (MILDAF) Program in the training of local police and SWAT teams as well as our Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Outreach group in the training of our prehospital affiliates. I also partner with our Safe Kids coordinator to assure that safety initiatives are

being provided across the lifespan.

I am a member of the Pedestrian Safety Coalition, Motorcycle Safety Coalition and the NJ Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Council. I assist with the Hospital-Based Violence Intervention Program (HVIP) and the Trauma Family Support Group. I am also an editor to the Trauma Newsletter "Trauma Time" and cochair to the APP Symposium.

My free time is spent enjoying time with my wonderfully large family, my husband John, our boys John, Brian and Nolan, my parents, sisters, brothers-in-law, nieces and nephews.

Trauma has been the core of my entire career. I am extremely grateful for the unique role that has given me the opportunity to be able to share my knowledge and experience with the community and continue to be involved in patient care.


